Alert issued as low pressure system brings heavy rain to Andhra Pradesh

From Our Staff Reporter Amaravati Oct 23: A distinct low pressure area in the southwest Bay of Bengal is expected to weaken gradually and transform into a low-pressure zone within the next 12 hours. Meanwhile, a surface circulation continues along the Andaman Sea coast, intensifying the likelihood of heavy rains across Andhra Pradesh over the next 24 hours. The Meteorological Department has issued a red alert statewide, warning of flash floods in Guntur, Prakasam, Nellore, Chittoor, and Kurnool districts, as well as in Yanam. Officials have cautioned fishermen against heading out to



CM orders vigilant amid heavy rains in Andhra Pradesh

From Our Staff Reporter due to a severe low-pressure area forming over the Bay of Bengal. Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, while on a tour of Dubai, has been in constant communication with officials regarding the situation in the state. In discussions with ministers, Chief Secretary, and Regional Transport officials, the Chief Minister addressed the challenges faced by rain-affected districts including Nellore, Prakasam, Bapatla, Kadapa, and Tirupati. He instructed the Home Minister to ensure readiness of machinery and necessary precautions.

CM Naidu recommended Amaravati, Oct., 23: the deployment of National Andhra Pradesh is currently Disaster Response Force experiencing heavy rainfall (NDRF) and State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) teams to the areas most impacted by the rainfall. He emphasised the need for immediate measures to safeguard lives and properties and called for coordinated efforts among the Revenue, Disaster Management, Police, Irrigation, Municipal, Roads and Buildings (R&B), and Electricity departments. In response to the potential for flooding, Naidu ordered the evacuation of residents in low-lying areas to safer locations. Officials informed the Chief Minister that control rooms have already been established in the South



Coastal Andhra Rayalaseema districts. Further, the Chief Minister proposed the fortification of canals and ponds in vulnerable areas to prevent collapses. He also urged officials to establish medical camps to mitigate the risk of infectious diseases following the heavy rainfall.

We will bring the fishermen back safely: Rammohan Naidu



From Our Staff Reporter Vizianagaram, October 23: Union Minister Rammohan Naidu issued a statement on Thursday on the incident of eight district fishermen being captured by Bangladesh Navy personnel. He said that he is providing full assurance to the affected families. He assured that the fishermen from the district will be brought back safely. He said that he has already held talks with the External Affairs

Minister. He said that he is in continuous contact with the Bangladesh Embassy and is closely monitoring the situation. Rammohan Naidu explained in the letter that he has spoken to the Coast Guard system, which looks after maritime security, law and order, on this issue. Eight fishermen from Vizianagaram district have been caught by the Bangladesh Coast Guard. They hail from

Tippalavalasa village in Pusapatirega mandal and Kondrajupalem village in Bhogapuram mandal and migrated to Vizag for a better life. They continue to fish in the sea and make a living there. On the 13th of this month, they went out to sea on a fishing boat (No. MM75) from the Visakhapatnam fishing port. On the 14th of this month, at 2 am, they lost their way and entered the Bangladesh Coast Guard area.

All depts advised to remain on alert as heavy rains forecast

From Our Staff Reporter Kurnool, Oct., 23: In the wake of the impending cyclonic storm, District Collector Dr A Siri instructed all line departments to remain on high alert and take all necessary precautionary measures to ensure public safety on Wednesday. She said that heavy rains are likely in the district over the next few days, and the administration must act swiftly to prevent any potential damage to life and property.

The Collector directed officials to closely monitor reservoirs, tanks, lowlying and riverbank areas, and to take advance measures to prevent breaches and flooding. She emphasised the need to issue timely alerts to the public and relocate people from vulnerable areas if required. She instructed the revenue, irrigation,



police, panchayat raj, and electricity departments to work in close coordination and maintain constant communication with the public. She also ordered the suspension of traffic at overflowing streams and rivulets, diverting vehicles through safe alternative routes. Electricity department officials were directed to secure power lines and prevent accidents. Dr Siri stressed that protecting human lives

and preventing loss of property should be the top priority of the administration. She instructed officials to conduct continuous reviews of the ground situation and remain vigilant until the weather conditions improve. Agriculture and horticulture officers were asked to provide timely advisories to farmers to minimize crop damage and ensure proper water drainage in agricultural lands.

Is the era of smartphones coming to an end?

The theory of natural selection, described by Charles Darwin, also applies to our modern lives. According to that theory, it cannot be said that the strongest or most intelligent species on earth will survive forever. Only species that understand and adapt to changes will survive. This is called adaptation. This applies not only to species but also to technologies created by humans. Experts say that the era of smartphones will soon end due to the unprecedented changes taking place in technology. This does not mean that smartphones will disappear now. Hundreds of millions of people around the world rely on smartphones for communication, payments, work, and entertainment. But according to the predictions of some futurists, smartphones will be swallowed up by another cutting-edge technology, just as laptops took the place of desktop PCs. This technology can be anything. It can be wearables. While companies like Apple and Meta are already making some smart glasses, others are integrating computer screens into contact lenses. Over time, it is expected that earphones powered by artificial intelligence could reduce the dependence on mobile phones. If not, artificial intelligence assistants (AI assistants) that work by listening to the voice could also be alternatives to smartphones.

Things like chatbots have already been incorporated into wearables. This could lead to a computing system that works with words instead of touch screens. Augmented reality (AR) glasses will improve many of the tasks that phones do. It could be navigation, calls, or browsing. In addition, projects like the Neuralink project, which is currently in the research phase, are trying to connect computers directly to our brains. That means that we can do things just by thinking with our brains! There are differing opinions on how long it will take for smartphones to disappear completely. Some predict five to ten years... while others say that the use of smartphones will continue, but that the constant dependence on them will decrease due to AR and AI devices. Some predict that in the next twenty years, smartphones will be replaced by AI-powered glasses, earbuds, and voice assistants, and that smartphones will become a relic like iPods and landlines. It is also a longterm prediction that technologies like AR and brain-computer interfaces will need to become accessible to the common man before smartphones disappear, and that technologies like quantum processing, 5G/6G+, and ultra-thin batteries may take two to three decades to mature. It is also interesting to see what efforts companies are currently making in this direction.

Apple is banking on spatial computing. It is said that this will help users move away from iPhones in ten to fifteen years. Companies like Meta, Google, and Samsung are trying to invent a world without smartphones with the help of AR wearables. Experiments are underway on how the 'AI Pin' and 'Rabbit R1' made by the Humane company can be alternatives to smartphones. On the other hand, telecom companies are trying to make the 6G network available for AR, VR, and AI systems by 2030. The dominance of smartphones is currently likely to continue until the 2030s. In the face of the convergence of AI and AR technologies, smartphones may remain a useful backup device in the future. Experts estimate that smartphones will gradually disappear from people's daily lives by 2040. The disappearance of smartphones has both advantages and disadvantages. Let's look at the advantages first. The need for small screens will disappear. Everything will happen naturally due to AR glasses, AI voice, and ambient computing. Many of the current problems with smartphones will disappear. New industries will emerge centered on AI, AR, wearables, and brain computing technologies. If smartphones are replaced by reusable AR glasses, electronic waste will disappear. The disadvantages are that AI, AR, and wearables risk focusing more on personal details There is a possibility of recording and tracking daily activities, as well as listening to our conversations. If developing countries are unable to access these new technologies, social gaps will increase further.

And what about phone manufacturers? Smartphone manufacturers like Foxconn, Pegatron, and Samsung employ hundreds of thousands of people in China, Vietnam, and India. Without smartphones, these factories would have to shift to making AR glasses, wearables, and micro- or internet-based devices. While some people may lose their jobs in the early days, they could be redeployed to AR and other devices. Companies that make batteries, display units, and chipsets for phones will adapt to making micro-devices. In a world without smartphones, apps will still exist, but not in the same form. Chat-based, gesture-based, and voice-based applications will come into play. Jobs will only exist if skills are developed further. In other words, jobs will not disappear, but their nature will change. The web designers of a few years ago have now shifted to making smart applications. It is no tragedy that the Internet-enabled smartphones that became available in 2007 will disappear before the end of our generation. We should be happy that the world is moving towards another cutting-edge technology. There are evolutionary processes in technology too. If we embrace them, we will move forward. Otherwise, we will remain where we are!

Tejashwi Yadav Could Be Bihar's Future - Or Opposition's Greatest Mistake. Here's Why

As Bihar's political landscape heats up ahead of the next aselections, the Mahagathbandhan has announced the Rashtriya Janata Dal's (RJD) Tejashwi Yadav, son of Lalu Yadav, as the alliance's chief ministerial candidate. The decision, coming after intense debate amongst partners, could potentially determine the electoral fate of the alliance in a state known for its complex caste arithmetic and volatile political equations. But is this a masterstroke or a strategic gamble?

The Case for Tejashwi The arguments in favour of projecting Tejashwi Yadav as the CM face are substantial and rooted in both electoral data and political momentum. This decision would energise the cadre of the RJD - the single largest party in Bihar and the leader Mahagathbandhan - and galvanise its core vote blocs. Tejashwi has emerged as a popular leader who commands significant grassroots support, particularly among the youth, Yadavs and Muslims. His projection would provide clarity and direction to the political campaign and give the RJD organisation a clear figurehead

to rally behind. Perhaps the most compelling factor to consider is that 15% of voters, according to the VoteVibe survey, make their decision based on the chief ministerial candidate. In a tightly contested election where margins are small - razorthin in 2020 - this segment becomes crucial. By declaring Tejashwi as the chief ministerial face, the Mahagathbandhan has given these voters a clear alternative to the incumbent leadership, especially when the Home Minister's statement regarding the National Democratic Alliance's (NDA) chief ministerial pick has created confusion over whether Nitish Kumar will retain his chair post the elections or not.

The timing also appears opportune. Nitish Kumar is widely perceived to be suffering from a "fatigue factor" after multiple terms in office. Voters often grow weary of long-standing leaders, and Tejashwi's projection could capitalise on this anti-incumbency sentiment. Long-tenure CMs such as Sheila Dixit, Shivraj Singh Chouhan, Tarun Gogoi and Raman Singh, among others, lost elections after being in power for 15 years.

The contrast between the seasoned, ageing Nitish and the younger, more dynamic Tejashwi could work to the opposition's benefit, framing the election as a choice between the past and the future, especially when this may well be Nitish's last election. Surveys consistently show Tejashwi leading the chief ministerial race with 33%-35% ratings, making him the natural choice for the opposition. Had the Mahagathbandhan ignored this data-driven reality, it could have come across as working against popular sentiment, potentially demoralising supporters.

The youth factor cannot be understated. Voters aged 18-29 constitute approximately 25% of Bihar's electorate - a quarter of the voting population. Tejashwi's appeal in this demographic is substantial, thanks to his focus on employment, education, and opportunities. However, Prashant Kishor has also gained traction within this class. His promise of government jobs resonated powerfully in 2020.

Furthermore, declaring Tejashwi as the chief ministerial candidate would consolidate the core vote base of the alliance. The Yadav community, a crucial pillar of the MGB's support structure, would feel represented and validated. Combined with the fact that the alliance's Muslim support base commands a 32% share of the population, a clear chief minis-

terial projection could consolidate these votes and prevent any last-minute erosion to rival parties like the Jan Suraj or to fence-sitters. This gives the Mahagathbandhan a headstart of around 25% vote share.

Polarisation and Counter-Mobilisation

However, the decision to project Tejashwi comes with significant risks that cannot be dismissed. Perhaps the most serious concern is the possibility of counter-consolidation among upper castes and non-Yadav OBCs (NYOBCs). Bihar's caste dynamics are delicate, and an explicit Yadav face could trigger defensive voting patterns among certain communities and sharpen the forwardvs-backward narrative. The disgruntled upper caste or NYOBC voter who may have voted for Congress candidates from their community might stay at home or vote for the

The spectre of 2020 looms large in these calculations. The slogan "Tejashwi Tai Hai" (Tejashwi is decidedly coming to power) became a doubleedged sword in that election. While it mobilised core supporters, it simultaneously instilled fear among upper-caste voters who worried about their status and opportunities under a Yadav-led government. This apprehension contributed to the alliance's losses despite seemingly favourable pre-poll predictions and COVID mismanagement. There's also a legitimate concern about communal polarisation. With Tejashwi in the fray, NDA could attempt to frame the election in a communal tone - positioning him as the chief ministerial face for minorities, turning the election into a Hindu-vs-Muslim contest. This could take away the focus from governance issues, development, or incumbent failures.



The non-Yadav OBC factor deserves special attention. These communities - backward classes other than Yadavs - felt marginalised during the Lalu-Rabri tenure from 1990 to 2005. They then got a Chief Minister in Nitish. Now, they may fear that their interests will be subordinated to Yadav priorities under a Tejashwi-led government. This perception could neutralise the

Mahagathbandhan's efforts to woo these communities with higher ticket allocations.

It also gives the NDA a chance to rake up the corruption issue plaguing the Lalu family and deflect attention from some of the allegations made by Prashant Kishor against its own senior leaders. It could help the NDA re-ignite

fear amongst upper castes, NYOBCs and EBCs, though the announcement of Mukesh Sahani as the deputy chief minister face may neutralise these concerns to some extent among EBCs. On the flip side, it could also open a Pandora's box if Dalits and Muslims feel cheated for not being represented.

Strategic Dilemma Or Masterstroke?

The Mahagathbandhan finds itself navigating two political realities. On one hand, modern electoral politics increasingly demands clear leadership projection - voters want to know who they're voting for, not just which alliance. Ambiguity can appear weak or indecisive. On the other hand, Bihar's intricate social fabric means that explicit

projections can trigger unintended consequences that undermine the very coalition being constructed. We will get to know only post-poll which factor was more powerful: the projection of a clear Chief Ministerial face or the countermobilisation it might trigger. Data suggests Tejashwi has significant support, but 2020 demonstrated that support doesn't automatically translate into victory when counter-forces mobilise effectively. Hereon, the Mahagathbandhan should carry out calibrated messaging - projecting Tejashwi's leadership while emphasising unity, inclusive governance, coalition values, common manifesto and issue-based campaigning that transcends caste considerations.

Rally Woman Dies in Road Accident

While walking towards the Ravulapalem bus stand after finishing her personal work, she was hit by an RTC bus (AP 39 CM 1079) from Bhimavaram depot around 10:30 a.m. Eyewitnesses said the driver was negligent and failed to honk before the collision. Kotamma, who suffered severe injuries, died on the way to Kottapeta Government Hospital in a 108 ambulance. Based on a complaint by her grandson Undavalli Durgaprasad, Ravulapalem SI G. Chanti registered a case and started an investigation.


JAHNVI KAPOOR BECOMES OPEN BOOK ABOUT PLASTIC SURGERY
