Three killed after a lorry creates havoc in NTR

Nagar of Nellore

**Nellore:** A serious road accident occurred Tuesday in NTR Nagar, resulting in the deaths of three individuals and leaving many more injured. The incident unfolded when a container lorry transporting fish barreled down the national highway at high speed, colliding with several locals. The lorry first crashed into a Tata Ace vehicle and three motorbikes, before careening into a tree, finally coming to a halt. Eyewitnesses reported chaos as the lorry ploughed through pedestrians engaged in small businesses along the roadside. Panic ensued in the busy area, which is usually

bustling with activity. The police arrived to the scene, where they transported the injured to a nearby hospital for treatment. Unfortunately, the condition of some victims remains critical. According to preliminary investigations, the accident appears to have been caused by the negligence of the lorry driver, who was travelling from Chennai to Kolkata and failed to adhere to local speed restrictions and warning signs. Authorities have registered a case and begun an investigation, as the district grapples with the aftermath of this tragic event that has left the community in shock.

#### **NIA sentences 2 more in Pak-linked Visakhapatnam Navy spying case**

New Delhi, Nov., 11 (UNI): Two more accused persons have been sentenced to Simple Imprisonment (SI) in the Pakistanlinked Visakhapatnam Navy espionage case by a Special Court of the National Investigation Agency (NIA), an official said on Tuesday. The NIA Special Court at Visakhapatnam (Andhra Pradesh) has sentenced Kalavalapalli Konda Babu of Visakhapatnam District (Andhra Pradesh) and Aviansh Somal of Kangra District (Himachal Pradesh) to 5 years and 10 months of SI under each of sections 18 of UA(P) Act and section 3 of the Official Secrets Act.

The court has also imposed a fine of Rs 5,000 each, and in the event of default of payment, the ac-

With this, a total of six accused persons have been convicted and sentenced in the case so far, relating to spying at vital installations and Indian Navy establishments by foreign spies/agents with the intent to threaten its unity, integrity, security and sovereignty. Karwar (Karnataka) respectively in the case RC-05/

The NIA investigations revealed that they were in touch with foreign intelligence agencies through WhatsApp, and were involved in the sharing of sensitive and classified information related to Indian Defence establishments and deployments. As per investigations, both men had come in contact with Pakistan intelligence agents through Facebook initially.

# **BIG WIN FOR NDA** NO PK IMPACT, PREDICT EXIT POLLS

**New Delhi:** The Bharatiya Janata Party and the Janata Dal United (and their smaller allies, including Chirag Paswan's Lok Janshakti Party) will record a comfortable win in the 2025 Bihar Assembly election, picking up 147 of the state's 243 seats, according to the combined data from multiple exit polls. The Rashtriya Janata Dal-led opposition alliance, which includes the Con-

the RJD's Teiashwi Yadav as its chief ministerial candidate, will finish a distant second with 90 seats. And, crucially, poll strategist Prashant Kishor's Jan Suraaj Party, seen as a dark horse that could play the role of kingmaker in a politically volatile state, is likely to crash on its electoral debut. Kishor's party is not expected to win more than one

seat, at best. As many as five seats could go to nonaligned parties and independent candidates. Health warning: exit poll data is unpredictable and may not reflect final results. The majority mark in the Bihar Assembly is 122. The biggest predicted wins are offered by P-Marq, Dainik Bhaskar, TIF Research, and Matrize. The P-Marq figures indicated the NDA will get between 142

Mahgathbandhan will struggle to get more than 98 and Kishor's Jan Suraj between one and four. Incidentally, P-Marq is the only exit poll to offer Prashant Kishor at least one seat. TIF Research also reported a big win for the BJP-led coalition, with 145 to 163 seats going the way of Prime MInister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Nitish Kumar

# **Tapping the** treasury for votes

Bihar is gearing up for the second phase of polling. The NDA government has announced a huge welfare package to woo voters in Bihar, which has a population of 1.30 million. This comes with serious economic implications. The two most important current schemes are already draining up to 10 percent of the state's revenue. Before voters go to the polling booths, 1.5 crore women have been able to receive Rs. 10,000 in cash directly from their bank accounts under the Mukhyamantri Mahila Rozgar Yojana (MMRY) scheme. The actual cost is likely to increase further as more women register. Another 1.1 crore people, mainly widows, old women and the disabled, have had their monthly pensions tripled from Rs. 400 to Rs. 1,100. As a result, the annual pension has increased by Rs. 8,400 per pensioner. This total is Rs. Increased additional burden up to Rs. 9420 crore. Together, these two schemes will have to allocate one-tenth of the state budget revenue for 2025-26. It is important to note that these are not just guarantees. The MMRY scheme funds have already been distributed. The allocation of pension funds has also started from July. Who will bear such a huge amount? Will the MMRY scheme funds come from loans? Or will they come as grants from the central government? It has been reported that all this amount increased under social security will be borne from the state treasury. But how much will this impact the funds for other development programs? Will the state government reduce its capital expenditure? Does this mean cutting the investments required for the construction of new roads, schools, power generation, and other development programs? Will the increased fiscal deficit result in delays in the payment of salaries to state government employees and teachers? All these are arising. To put it bluntly, has the NDA welfare package sown the seeds of economic ruin in the poorest and least developed state of Bihar in the country? Last year, Bihar's fiscal deficit was 9.2 percent of the state's GDP. Normally, state gov-

ernments can afford to run a fiscal deficit three times. When the budget for the current fiscal year was presented in March, the state government boldly promised to reduce the fiscal deficit to 3 percent. However, that is unlikely to happen now, dashing hopes of a welfare package. However, voters seem happy with the announcement of the state government's huge welfare package. The opposition parties are staying away from criticizing the Chief Minister's fiscal irresponsibility. In competition with this, they have also announced their own welfare with huge promises. This political game is very different at the field level. Because the Nitish government is already implementing its promises, voters are under the impression that the opposition alliance is only making promises. Directly depositing cash into the voters' accounts without the involvement of middlemen or corruption seems to be a plus point for Nitish. In the past, only 15 percent of the benefits of such cash distribution and other schemes were received by the beneficiaries. It is natural that there is a lot of opposition to the Chief Ministers in power. If the governance in the states is not good, they vent their anger by voting against it when elections come. Nitish took precautions in this regard in advance. He noticed the opposition to the government and turned it in his favor. They tried to overcome the slight opposition among the voters by joining hands with the Modi government and coming to power. They worked to appease the voters with huge welfare schemes. Will huge welfare schemes be a game changer in this situation? On the other hand, the main opposition alliance won the 'Maha Ghatbandhan' and promised to provide a job to every family within 20 days of forming the government. There are 2.97 crore families in Bihar. Even if we calculate that each family will have to spend Rs. 15,000 to Rs. 20,000 per month, the total expenditure will have to be Rs. 5.35 lakh crore to Rs. 7.13 lakh crore. This shows the absurdity of the job promise. This simple statistic shows the emptiness of the Maha Ghatbandhan idea. Apart from this, interest-free cash for five years of Rs. 5 lakhs, crop procurement guarantee, and free electricity supply up to 200 units are all major features included in the Mahaghatbandhan manifesto. However, economic experts and political observers argue that these free guarantees will not have any impact on the results. In these circumstances, it is noteworthy that many women who are receiving Rs. 10 thousand through bank accounts are also demanding a change in the government.

# **Longest U.S. Govt Shutdown Ends With Few Concessions To Democrats**

After forty bruising days of recrimination and paralysis, the United States Senate on Sunday night finally broke the logjam that had shuttered the federal government, stalled air traffic, and thrown millions of Americans into uncertainty. In a 60-40 vote, senators from both parties agreed to advance a compromise funding package that—if passed in the coming days-would reopen the government through January 30 and set the stage for a December showdown over health care subsidies. The breakthrough, forged after days of backroom negotiations among eight centrist Democrats, Senate Republican leaders, and the White House, represents the first glimmer of bipartisan functionality since the record-setting shutdown began. But as Senate Majority Leader John Thune (R-S.D.) acknowledged late Sunday, "We're not out of the woods yet." The deal still needs to clear the full Senate, survive the House-where Democratic leaders have already vowed resistance-and secure President Donald Trump's signature. The thaw began, ironically, not in the party leadership suites but among a small band of pragmatic centrists weary of the impasse and the mounting public anger it produced. Led by Sens. Jeanne Shaheen (D-N.H.), Angus King (I-Maine), and Maggie Hassan (D-N.H.)—all former governors who pride themselves on dealmaking—the group reopened lines of communication with Thune and senior White House aides late last week.

The compromise that emerged was deceptively simple: Democrats would agree to end the shutdown immediately, allowing government funding to resume, in exchange for a guaranteed Senate vote by mid-December on legislation to extend the enhanced Affordable Care Act (ACA) subsidies that expired earlier this year. Republicans, for their part, agreed to restore pay for all furloughed federal employees, readministration's controversial layoffs during the shutdown, and ensure food stamp benefits through fiscal 2026. For both sides, it was a face-saving formula—thin on immediate

and relief. "It's the only deal on the table," Shaheen told reporters. "Waiting another week or another month wouldn't have delivered a better outcome." The vote to advance the package marked a significant moment of bipartisanship. Eight Democrats—among them Shaheen, Hassan, King, Tim Kaine (Va.), Catherine Cortez Masto (Nev.), John Fetterman (Pa.), Maggie Hassan (N.H.), Jeanne Shaheen (N.H.), and Jacky Rosen (Nev.)-joined Republicans to break their own party's filibuster. Republican Sen. Rand Paul (Ky.) was the lone dissenter on the GOP side, demanding unrelated amendments concerning hemp production in his state. But for most Republicans, the calculus was clear: the shutdown was politically unsustainable, the economic pain mounting, and the Thanksgiving travel season threatening to turn chaos into crisis. Thune hailed the vote as a "turning point," expressing hope the final passage could come as early as Monday. "We had a good vote tonight," he said. "Now we'll see how motivated people are tomorrow." The agreement, however, has left deep fissures within the Democratic caucus. Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer and other top Democrats opposed the deal, arguing that yielding without securing immediate ACA relief amounted to capitulation. Progressives such as Sen. Bernie Sanders (I–Vt.) and Sen. John Hickenlooper (D-Colo.) blasted the compromise as premature. "If Democrats cave on this issue, it gives Trump a light green toward authoritarianism," Sanders warned. Hickenlooper was more resigned but no less frustrated: "There's no good choice. But this strongman approach to governing cannot become normal." Others saw it differently. Kaine and Fetterman—both vocal supporters of ending the shutdown—insisted that reopening the government was the only haemorrhaging. "Reopen our government, and then we can find a way to lower health care costs," Fetterman said. Kaine added that thousands of fed-

According to aides, the White House quietly endorsed the Senate compromise once it became clear that the economic fallout was spilling into critical constituencies—from airline passengers to farmers reliant on federal subsidies. The president's initial refusal to negotiate over ACA subsidies insisting instead that funds be redirected directly to Americans—had triggered the standoff in the first place. But as FAA-mandated flight reductions began strangling air traffic and agricultural payments halted across states, the administration's stance softened. Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy warned that air travel would soon be "reduced to a trickle" as Thanksgiving approached. Meanwhile, the Department of Agriculture instructed states to cut back on food stamp benefits after the Supreme Court refused to intervene on emergency funding. For the first time in weeks, the shutdown's pain became visible in everyday life. By most estimates, the shutdown has already cost the U.S. economy more than \$20 billion—roughly \$500 million per day in lost productivity, delayed contracts, and disrupted services. and research scientists. antees full back pay for furloughed employees, the disruption to essential services has left scars. Air traffic controllers in major hubs like Atlanta and Chicago reported burnout and resignations. Federal health agencies slowed clinical trial approvals, delaying access to experimental drugs for patients with critical conditions. The Centers for Disease Control's seasonal influenza outreach programs were suspended, and the National Institutes of Health halted dozens of grant reviews. Rural communities were hit especially hard as USDA offices shuttered, delaying farm loans and food assistance. In cities, thousands of low-income families saw delays in housing vouchers and food benefits. "The government's closure has been devastating for families already on the edge," said one policy analyst with the Urban Institute. "You can't just flip a switch and resume normal operations after 40 days of dysfunction." The Senate adjourned late Sunday, with lawmakers expected to reconvene Monday morning for final procedural votes. If the funding package passes the Senate, it will move to the House where its fate is uncertain.

House Minority Leader Hakeem Jeffries (D-N.Y.) has already vowed to "fight" the measure, calling it "a GOP bill that fails to extend the Affordable Care Act tax credits." But with many House members stranded by flight cancellations, and growing pressure from constituents, even Democratic hardliners may find it difficult to oppose reopening the government outright.

The emerging deal may not be a grand bargain, but in Washington's current climate, it is a rare act of collective pragmatism. Both sides have something to claim: Republicans can say they reopened government without conceding on ACA subsidies; Democrats can point to guarantees of worker protections, food security funding, and a coming vote on health care relief. As Thune noted, "We're here because people chose to work together." Yet, the real test lies ahead. The December vote on ACA subsidies could easily reignite the same ideological clashes that caused this shutdown. For now, though, the Senate's action offers a fleeting moment of relief—a pause in the political trench warfare that has come to define the nation's governance. As the Capitol dome glowed over a weary city Sunday night, staffers filed out of their offices, the corridors echoing with a sentiment rare in today's Washington: cautious optimism.

He was thrown out of his job and declared mentally unstable. Turns out he wasn't wrong; he was just in the wrong city. Had he been in Delhi, he would have found takers for his worldview - there is pollution anyway, why not add to it by bursting crackers? Research shows that toxic air is reducing the life span of Delhi residents by a decade. So, why not get it over with? As they say, "dhuan dhuan kar do". The smog on the streets is dense, but not as much as the combination of political failure, whataboutery and public indifference that has made bad air days a part of our calendar. Collective Resignation

A couple of years ago, we ranted about bad air days. We posted pictures wearing masks, using hashtags such as #righttobreathe, and criticised authorities. Some of us still do, but many have now given up. Instead, many of us are trying to work around it. We are stocking up on medicines and masks, buying air purifiers, opting for WFH, and those who can are leaving the city for a these options, and those who don't have stopped caring. But something has changed this year that has brought the illusion... er...delusion of relief to many. Every year, it would be a morning ritual to check the AQI before stepping out. Depending on whether the ranking was 'very poor', 'severe' or 'hazardous', curbs would be imposed and people would prepare themselves for the day ahead. This year, this ritual has become immaterial. Because no matter how bad it looks, the AQI remains in the same range. Multiple reports claim tampering with AQI data and the spraying of water at pollution sensors to keep the numbers at saner levels. Irrespective of whether these allegations are true, people know they cannot trust the data anymore. So, the lungs are not getting enough oxygen, and the brain is not getting reliable information. We can't breathe, and we can't

We're Still Asking Questions But, this is not where it ends. Till some years back, Delhiites would ask angry questions to those in power about the capital's annual tryst with toxic air. Ministers and officials

would mumble some complex

numbers and assure that the

issue would be resolved next year - a promise that was never fulfilled. This has changed. Those in the driving seat don't need to answer now. The people are doing it for them. Try this: post about pollution or crackers in your residential society's WhatsApp group or on social media. Some may express solidarity, but a large section would throw a bunch of questions at you. "Why are farmers burning stubble?", "What did the previous government do?", "Why only our festivals are targeted?", "Can you live without your AC?", "Delhi was always like this". The government is not on trial, the citizen is. You are. You have to defend your own questions, justify your demand for clean air. It is difficult to keep arguing with a headache, sore throat and a persistent cough, so many of us choose silence and repeat to ourselves: this too shall pass. Some of us, however, muster enough will and courage to hit the streets. A protest call is given, placards drawn and slogans readied. The venue is India Gate. But as soon as the agitation begins, police arrive and tell the protesters they do not have permission to protest at India Gate (it is a wonder that they spotted the monument in the thick smog). Protesters are detained, loaded onto buses and driven away as senior officers explain why people cannot protest at India Gate, but can do so at Jantar Mantar. The policing is swift, unlike the Diwali night when the two-hour window


specified by the Supreme Court for bursting crackers was royally flouted. So, you can't breathe, can't know how bad the situation is, and can't protest. What can you do? You can wait. There will be some Supreme Court hearings, some political blame-game and some social media fights. These will keep you engaged till this passes. And when it will, we shall all pretend to forget about it. Until next year. Sadly, our lungs won't forget. The poisonous air does not discriminate between those who celebrate Diwali and those who don't, those who burst crackers and those who don't, and those who support a particular party and those who don't. One of us may win the debate, but none of us will win the fight to breathe.

Home stays must offer facilities like AC, TV, internet, clean environment, drinking water, and security, and owners must reside on-site. Each guest's ID must be recorded. The program includes training in hospitality, hygiene, and safety, with special focus on women and youth.

Registrations will be managed by the Andhra Pradesh Fourism Authority, and applications reviewed by the District Tourism Council. Home stays will be classified as Silver (basic) or Gold (premium). More details and applications are available on the Tourism Department website, said District Tourism Officer P. Venkatachalam.

# Not Riyan Parag, These 2 Stars Among Shortlisted To Be RR Captain If Sanju Samson Leaves: Report

Bengaluru: One potentially high-profile transfer that might take place ahead of the IPL 2026 auction is that of Sanju Samson leaving Rajasthan Royals for Chennai Super Kings. While there has been no official confirmation regarding the move, several reports suggest that franchises have held initial discussions with the players involved. To complete the process, both CSK and RR must submit an expression of interest to the IPL Governing Council, naming the three players involved in the potential deal. Once the players give their written consent, the franchises can finalise the agreement, which will then need to be ratified by the governing council, according to ESPNcricinfo. Sanju Samson has been the face of Rajasthan Royals for more than a decade, representing the franchise in 11 seasons. According to a report in TOI, wicketkeeperbatter Dhruv Jurel and Team India opener Yashasvi Jaiswal are two likely picks for the captain's post if Samson indeed leaves. Having joined RR in 2013, he quickly became one of their key players and was retained ahead of the 2014 season at just 19 years old.

After RR's two-year suspension (2016-17), Samson re-

turned in 2018 and took over the captaincy in 2021. Under his leadership and with the guidance of team director Kumar Sangakkara, RR reached the IPL final in 2022 - their first appearance since winning the inaugural edition in 2008. Samson led the team in 67 matches, winning and losing 33 each. He had his best IPL season in 2024, scoring 531 runs at an average of 48.27 and a strike rate of 153.47. He was retained for Rs 18 crore ahead of the 2025 season, but a side injury midway through the campaign ruled him out of the second half of the tournament. RR's form collapsed, and they lost several close matches, finishing ninth out of ten. Samson remains RR's all-time leading run-scorer with 4,027 runs, holds the joint-most 50-plus scores (25), and has taken the most catches (149) for the franchise. After the 2025 season, he informed RR management that he wanted a change, prompting the team to explore trade options with other franchises. On the other hand, Ravindra Jadeja has been an integral part of the Chennai Super Kings since joining them in 2012. Apart from the two years when CSK were suspended, Jadeja has been part of the franchise's



core for over a decade, contributing to three of their five IPL titles. He was retained for Rs 18 crore ahead of the 2025 mega auction as CSK's secondchoice player after captain Ruturaj Gaikwad. The allrounder has played 254 IPL matches - the fifth-most in tournament history - and is CSK's leading wicket-taker with 143

scalps, including a best of 5/16. Jadeja's most memorable moment came in the 2023 IPL final, when his last-over heroics against the Gujarat Titans sealed the title for CSK. It was also his best bowling season, taking 20 wickets, followed by another solid batting performance in 2025, where he scored 301 runs with two fifties.

# Sourav Ganguly's Clear Message To BCCI Selectors On Mohammed Shami After South Africa Series Snub

New Delhi: Former India captain Sourav Ganguly wants to see Mohammed Shami back in the Indian team across formats, as he reckons the skillful pacer is "fit and is bowling exceptionally well." The Ajit Agarkar-led selection committee, however, appears to have moved on from the 35-year-old, who has been ignored for the upcoming two-Test series against South Africa and last played in the Champions Trophy in March. "Shami is bowling exceptionally well. He is fit, and we saw that in the three Ranji Trophy matches, where he won games for Bengal on his own," Ganguly said after being announced as the global brand ambassador of Kabuni, a UKbased AI-driven sports coaching platform. Shami has so far claimed 15 wickets to help Bengal secure successive wins in their first two Ranji Trophy matches before going wicketless against Tripura. He has bowled 91 overs in three matches this season. The veteran pacer underwent ankle



surgery following the 2023 World Cup, where he finished as the tournament's leading wicket-taker with 24 scalps at an average of 10.70. "I'm sure the selectors are watching, and there is communication between Mohammad Shami and the selectors. But if you ask me, in terms of fitness and skill, it's the Mohammad Shami we

know. So, I really don't see any reason why he can't keep playing Test matches, One-Day cricket, and T20 cricket for India. Because that skill is enormous," Ganguly said. With no red-ball assignments for India over the next six months, it remains to be seen if Shami has already played his last Test the World Test Championship

final against Australia at The Oval in June 2023. In the longer format, Prasidh Krishna and Akash Deep have become integral parts of the pace attack. With the 2027 ODI World Cup still two years away, Shami's recurring injury concerns could influence the selectors. *Ganguly wants Jurel in play-*

Turning his focus to the upcoming two-Test series beginning with the Eden Gardens match on Friday, Ganguly hoped that wicketkeeper-batter Dhruv Jurel finds a place purely on batting merit. "He's playing well, isn't he? Rishabh is back, and I don't know what the selectors are thinking. Basically, the spots are taken - two openers, (Shubman) Gill at 4, Pant at 5, KL (Rahul), (Ravindra) Jadeja are there. Players have performed. How easy will it be to open up a slot for Dhruv Jurel at this stage, I wouldn't know," Ganguly said. He suggested that the No. 3 spot could be an option, with Sai Sudharsan being the incumbent.

# Consent Obtained By All Three : Report Shares Big Update On Chennai Super Kings-Rajasthan Royals Trade Deal



Mumbai: The high-profile Ravindra Jadeja-Sam Curran-Sanju Samson trade could be finalised in the next 48 hours, according to a report. In what could be one of the most highprofile trades in the history of the Indian Premier League (IPL), Rajasthan Royals (RR) captain Sanju Samson is likely to join Chennai Super Kings (CSK), with all-rounders Ravindra Jadeja and Sam Curran reportedly set to go the other way as part of the deal. According to a report in Cricbuzz, the deal is on track as all three players have agreed to the deal, which could be completed in the next 48 hours.

"Consent has been obtained from all three players and the Expression of Interest process has been initiated. All three have signed on the dotted line, but the process will take some time to culminate," the report quoted a franchise official as

saying. However, both the franchises are yet to communicate the details regarding the Samson-Jadeja-Curran deal to the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI). "Understandably, the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) is required to be involved, and as of Monday (November 10) evening, neither franchise had officially informed the IPL or BCCI authorities. Atop official told Cricbuzz that the matter has not yet been brought to their notice something an official from one of the two franchises also confirmed," the report added.

But does retaining Rohit, who is 38, actually make sense for MI in the long run? Former India and Chennai Super Kings star Suresh Raina had an interesting observation. "They should hold him (Rohit Sharma); he has won a lot of trophies for them. Deepak Chahar is just in - it depends on what options they have, so they can either release him or retain him, but they might not get players at the auction.
