

BJP, JDU Bihar Clean Sweep Powered By Caste Matrix Boost, Muslim + Yadav Push

Patna: The BJP and Janata Dal United are set to record a dominant win over the opposition in the Bihar election, thumping Tejashwi Yadav's Rashtriya Janata Dal and the Congress by over 160 seats.

One of the bedrocks of this win will be the strong showing among Extremely and Other Backward

Castes, as well as Sched- the former and the uled Castes and Tribes. And another, critical, platform will be the Muslim + Yadav community that appears to have pivoted from the Mahagathbandhan. Going into Friday's counting of votes, two exit polls - Axis My India and Matrize - said the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance would sweep

Mahagathbandhan the latter. The Axis My India figures said the NDA would get 49 per cent of votes from SC communities, 56 per cent from STs, 58 per cent from EBCs, and 63 per cent from OBCs. Matrize put 51 per cent of OBC voters and 49 per cent of SC voters in the NDA's camp. Both put 78

per cent of the Muslim votes in the Mahagat hbandhan's pocket. As counting progressed, it turned out the caste matrix did favour the NDA. The Kurmi+Koeri community, for example, from which Chief Minister Nitish Kumar hails, voted, unsurprisingly, for the NDA by 65.7 per cent to 31.9 per cent. (Turn to Page 2)

If the givers of life are the Yamakinkaras

According to the saying, Vaidyo Narayano Hari, it is the doctors who should save the lives of the patients who are the ones who are giving life to the terrorist ghost who commits murder. The role of some doctors behind the terrorist suicide bombing near the Red Fort in Delhi is the most sensational incident in the history of the country. This is completely a conspiracy of the Faridabad terror module. A detailed plan was prepared to carry out attacks in four cities across the country. It has been revealed that eight suicide bombers were prepared for this. It has been revealed through their diaries that Dr. Umar Nabi and Dr. Muzammil played a key role in this conspiracy plan. The investigation agencies have found that a strategy for terrorist activities was formed in a room of the boys' hostel of the Medical College of Al Falah University in Faridabad. The latest information is that the accused have collected funds of about Rs. 20 lakh for this conspiracy. So far, terrorist activities have been going on along the Kashmir borders and it has been a routine for the security forces to disrupt them. But now, preparations for terrorist activities are underway in cities within the country itself, which is a new development. The security forces have been at the forefront of safeguarding the country's security by foiling hundreds of terror plots in the last two decades. However, the evidence obtained about the terrorist suicide bombing at Delhi's Red Fort suggests that it was a hasty act. Because it was revealed that one of the perpetrators of this atrocity had been arrested in advance and tried to escape from the trap and flee, which led to the suicide bombing. However, an unimaginable disaster has occurred. The fact that one of the conspirators escaped clearly shows how the security agencies are sleeping. In the context of regular operations to control infiltration from inside and outside the Jammu and Kashmir region, it highlights the gross failure of the security agencies to prevent a terrorist incident in urban areas like Faridabad, unlike Jammu and Kashmir. Wherever such incidents occur in the country, the security agencies prevent them at lightning speed and save the lives of the people of the country. It is unfortunate that such a suicide bomber was not noticed in the national capital. The terrorist activities in the Kashmir Valley are suspected to be linked to the Faridabad network. The shockwaves of Operation Sindoor in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK) and Pakistan have further fueled the hatred of the poisonous snakes that nurture and nurture terrorism. It is believed that they were preparing to carry out attacks with three tons of deadly explosives in retaliation. If they had not been caught, much more destruction would have occurred. Before that, threatening posters were displayed in the Kashmir Valley. But since the security forces could not pay much attention, it can be said that the Faridabad terrorist plot was partially fulfilled. This shows that surveillance should be a continuous action that is carried out by every atom. What is more shocking than all this is the fact that medical professionals play a key role in this huge conspiracy. The fact that these medical graduates, who have taken the oath of medical profession, are involved in a terrorist conspiracy and are constantly working to spread terrorist ideology and convert others is an unimaginable consequence. At least five doctors were primarily responsible for this. Four of them were born and raised in Kashmir. This is a sign of a bigger problem. Educated people are secretly involved in anti-national activities, acquiring the most advanced communication equipment, learning online about the chemicals used to make various types of bombs, getting trained in detonating them through remote control, and joining in these activities. All this is not only a big problem for the security forces, but also a threat to the lives of innocent people.

The perception that educated people are also actively involved in such white-collar terrorism has become a big challenge for the security agencies. After Operation Sindoor, there has been a change in geopolitics with Pakistan and Bangladesh. The threat of terrorism will not disappear with this. Their targets are looking far and wide beyond the Kashmir Valley. The responsibility of the security forces will not be fulfilled by carrying out attacks targeting terrorists. We should enhance the ability to collect intelligence information by coordinating efforts at the national level, integrating with the people of the respective regions, their living conditions and resources. Systems should be developed to immediately disrupt any conspiracy for terrorist activities wherever they are being hatched in the country. The time may not be favorable for this. But from a political perspective, it may be appropriate to restore statehood to Jammu and Kashmir while maintaining complete control over security.

Bihar's Lesson For Congress And Rahul Gandhi? Just Photo-Ops Won't Do

The National Democratic Alliance (NDA) has romped back home in Bihar - this time with a mandate more unambiguous than the one it received in 2020. In order of dominance, Bihar's current electoral landscape is divided among three parties the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), the Janata Dal (United, or JDU) and the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD). One outcome of this election has been the emergence of the JD(U) as the party with the second-largest number of seats. But a more significant outcome is the resurrection of Nitish Kumar as the kingmaker (and, possibly, king himself) and undisputed leader of the JD(U).

The Stunning Delivery Of JD(U) And Nitish

In the run-up to the elections, Kumar was being described as someone whose shelf life was over after 20 years in office. Doubts were cast - by his political detractors as well as by his allies - on the state of his mental and physical health. The NDA could not project an alternative chief ministerial face as there was none. The JD(U) had no leader who could seamlessly slip into Kumar's shoes. The ones the BJP had were either out of favour with the party's central leadership (Ravi Shankar Prasad, Rajiv Pratap Rudy) or had passed on (Sushil Modi), forcing it to bring to the fore controversial figures like Samrat Choudhary. So, what kind of turnaround happened in Bihar? Back in 2020, the NDA had won 125 out of a total of 243 seats, just three above the majority mark of 122. The Mahagathbandhan alliance (MGB) had won 110 seats. Despite the 15-seat gap, the popular vote was nearly tied, with the NDA at 37.26% and the MGB at 36.58%. The RJD was the single-largest party with 75 seats and 23.11% of the vote, followed by the BJP with 74 seats and 19.46% votes. The JDU had won 43 seats with 15.39% of votes, while the Congress took 19 seats with around 9.5% of the vote. At the time of writing, the BJP's tally is 94, the JDU's 83, and the Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) (LJP-RV) is hovering around 20. Within the Mahagathbandhan alliance, the RJD's tally is likely to be less than half (around 25), with the Congress getting around five seats. In terms of vote share, while the BJP seems poised around 21%, it is the JD(U)'s share that is seeing an upward swing of around 4%. If we take into account the performance of parties like the LJP(RV) or the Hindustani Awam Morcha (Secular) (HAM-S), the NDA alliance's tally will go up by at least 25 more seats, accounting for eight more percentage points of vote share.

What Really Happened In Bihar?

striking factors stand out in Bihar. Whether driven by the ?10,000 cash transfer or by other incentives is a matter for deeper research - but the first clear trend is that more women turned up to vote this time. The second trend challenges the conventional belief that higher voter turnout signals a desire for change. Bihar witnessed a 14% increase in turnout compared to 2020, and this surge appears to have worked in favour of the NDA alliance. In fact, it seems as though even after 20 years in office, voters came out in greater numbers to keep Nitish Kumar in power. It is clear that within the NDA, it was the BJP and the JDU which did the heavylifting. On the campaign trail, NDA partners were speaking in harmony, messaging across the board on local issues based on good governance, development and promise of jobs. This ensured a clear and uncluttered communication addressed to the voter.

Where The MGB Faltered In comparison, the Mahagathbandhan's messaging had different, even contradictory, strands. While Tejashwi Yadav was harping on jobs, welfare, and development issues targeted at Bihar's youth, Rahul Gandhi continued to highlight "vote chori" and issues aligned more with a pan-India perspective. The Congress party's initial reaction to the early trends stuck to the

As the results come in, two

same line. The party also dithered on projecting Tejashwi Yadav as a clear chief ministerial face. This lent credibility to the NDA's narrative that all was not well with Rahul Gandhi and Tejashwi Yadav. One subplot that ended quietly in this election was Prashant Kishor's electoral debut. After months of padyatras (foot marches), mobilisation drives and a highvoltage narrative of political disruption, his party failed to make a meaningful dent in either vote share or seats. For someone long regarded as India's most influential election strategist, the verdict underscored a sobering truth: political consultancy and political mass-building are fundamentally different crafts. Bihar's electorate did not see Kishor's party as a credible alternative, and his experiment, at least in this cycle, collapsed under the weight of its own expectations.

Congress Must Now Really

Bihar's outcome sharpens a question that has haunted the Congress ever since the INDIA experiment was conceived: what place does a weakened national party carve out for itself vis-à-vis assertive regional chieftains? In the NDA, the bargain in Bihar was crystal clear: the BJP would drive the national narrative organisational machine while conceding the leadership of the state to Nitish Kumar and allowing the JD(U) to grow. The campaign, seat-sharing, and messaging were aligned to that compact - and the results reflect that coherence. In the Mahagathbandhan, by contrast, the Congress neither fully embraced Tejashwi Yadav as the face of change nor offered a counter-vision of its own. The alliance looked less like a partnership and more like a negotiation in progress, and voters sensed that. That hesitation is not confined to Bihar. Rahul Gandhi's relationships with potential allies - Tejashwi in Bihar, Akhilesh Yadav in Uttar Pradesh, Mamata Banerjee in Bengal, Arvind Kejriwal in Delhi and Punjab, and others have produced striking images and joint rallies, but not a stable architecture of trust. Regional leaders bristle at the idea of yielding space to a Congress that is organisationally weaker in their states, while the Congress is reluctant to publicly accept a junior role or commit to clear power-sharing arrangements. The result is a politics of half-gestures: common press conferences without common

strategies, joint slogans without

joint cadres on the ground.

An Existential Dilemma Whether this is an institutional hesitancy or a reflection of Rahul Gandhi's personal style of engagement is open to debate. What Bihar shows with brutal clarity is that the cost is being paid at the ballot box. The Congress cannot revive itself nationally without encroaching on the anti-BJP space occupied by its regional partners. Yet, whenever it does so without a prior, honest settlement, it weakens the broader coalition and hands the BJP an advantage. That is the party's existential dilemma. And the BJP, far more disciplined in stitching together and managing its alliances, has learnt how to exploit it election after election. Ultimately, Bihar's verdict is not just a rejection of one alliance and an endorsement of another; it is a reminder that Indian voters reward clarity, cohesion, and credibility over sentiment and symbolism. The BJP-JD(U) formula worked because its hierarchy was settled and its message was stable. The Mahagathbandhan faltered because its centre of gravity was never agreed upon. For the Congress and Rahul Gandhi, the deeper lesson is that alliances cannot be episodic or personality-driven. They must be built, tended, and trusted -

Dear Delhi Polisters, Please Stop Writing Nitish Kumar Off Every Election

For a leader who has spent decades in power, Nitish Kumar remains a figure beyond calculations. Ahead of nearly every election, commentators predict his fall. They call him indecisive, fatigued, past his peak, or politically overextended. And yet, Bihar has repeatedly turned to him to anchor the state's politics for the last several elections. The 2025 election results have reinforced this pattern with striking clarity: Nitish Kumar remains Bihar's ultimate X-factor, and it's time we stop writing him off so easily.

A Vote Share That Makes Him Indispensable

What keeps Nitish Kumar at the heart of Bihar politics is plain numbers. Across cycles, he has consistently com-

manded a formidable 15-20% vote share on his own. In a fragmented state where no single party dominates across caste and regional divides, this is a mammoth share. It is why from 2005 to 2010, 2015, 2020, and the 2024 Lok Sabha election, political formations that have allied with him have usually ended up winning. Nitish retains credibility among a broad social coalition: OBCs, EBCs, Mahadalits, non-Yadav OBCs, and a steady section of Muslim voters. He is one of the few leaders in Bihar capable of pulling support from communities with competing political interests. One of the most understated aspects of Nitish's politics is the quiet trust he enjoys among Muslims. Under him, the JD(U) has positioned itself as a centrist, moderate counterweight to majoritarian politics. His presence keeps coalition politics balanced, ensuring that Bihar does not tilt ideologically like many other states have done. This brings him a sizable chunk of the Muslim vote. However, if there is a single constituency that has transformed Nitish Kumar's political fortunes, it is women arguably the most influential electoral bloc in Bihar today. This support is not sentimental; it is the direct result of policies that touched everyday lives. For instance, the Mukhyamantri Balika Cycle Yojana launched by his government encouraged girls' schooling.

Key Review on ONGC Fire Impact Steps to Address Fishermen's Issues: District Collector Shanmohan



Akhanda 2 Tells Greatness Of Sanathana Dharma: NBK





recently will start rolling soon.




How's Cult Shiva's Response After 36 Years?

'Hope They Boo Me': Cristiano Ronaldo's Remark On Dublin Crowd Ahead Of Ireland Clash

Portuguese superstar Cristiano Ronaldo said he wants Ireland fans to boo him World Cup qualifier in Dublin. Portugal will reach the 2026 World Cup finals with a victory and Ronaldo said if the crowd focused on him it could take pressure off his team-mates. The five-time Ballon d'Or winner is aiming to play at a sixth World Cup next summer and Portugal lead qualifying Group F by five points with two matches remaining. "The stadium will boo me, I'm used to it, I certainly hope they do -maybe it will take the pressure off other players," Ronaldo told a news conference Wednesday. Ronaldo said he expected it would be a "difficult" match, with Ireland sitting back and denying him and his team-mates space. The former Manchester United and Real Madrid forward was also asked about the possibility of scoring his 1000th career goal in the World Cup final. "You've been watching too many movies, that would be too perfect," laughed



Ronaldo, 40. "Getting back to reality, all this data makes me happy. A national team never depends on one player, but I like being able to make a difference with goals. "It's always good to score goals, that's my position. I want to play in this next World Cup, otherwise I wouldn't be here, but let's take it step by step."

Ronaldo, currently playing at Saudi Arabia side Al Nassr, has scored 953 goals in his career to date. The striker is the leading men's international goalscorer with 143 goals and said Tuesday he believes the 2026 World Cup will be his last and he expects to retire from football within a couple of years. However on Wednesday Ronaldo said he preferred to focus on the team's goal of qualifying rather than discuss his future in the game.

"There's no point in being repetitive and losing focus," he added. "Maybe later on I'll give more interviews and speak more clearly about what I think for the future, but Portugal has another opportunity to be in another finals."

Cristiano Ronaldo Elbows Ireland Player, Sent Off. Likely To Face Ban At World Cup



Cristiano Ronaldo is at serious risk of being banned for the first game of the 2026 World Cup if Portugal qualifies as expected. The soccer superstar was sent off for elbowing Ireland defender Dara O'Shea in the second half of a qualifying game Thursday that Portugal lost 2-0 in Dublin. Ronaldo will



serve a mandatory one-game ban imposed for any red card when Portugal hosts Armenia on Sunday, knowing a win will secure a place at the World Cup hosted by the United States, Canada, and Mexico. FIFA disciplinary rules require its judges to impose a ban of "at least two matches for serious foul play." The ban should be "at least three matches for violent conduct" or "at least three matches or an appropriate period of time for assault, including elbowing."

A FIFA ban would apply to competitive games and could not be served in pre-tournament exhibitions. Ronaldo spun round and swung his right elbow into O'Shea's back as they waited for the ball to be crossed around the hour mark at Aviva Stadium with Ireland holding a surprise 2-0 lead. The referee issued a yellow card but minutes later upgraded it to red after a video review at the pitchside monitor. Ronaldo curled his lips in a wry look as he walked off the field being jeered and mocked by Ireland

Historic Pole And Podium For Atiqa Mir In F1 Academy-Backed COTFA Series

Indian racing prodigy Atiqa Mir stormed to a historic pole position before finishing third on the podium in the opening round of the Formula 1 Academy backed COTFA UAE karting series here. The 10-yearold is the first Indian to be supported by Formula 1. Already part of the Champions of the Future Academy (COTFA) international series, Atiqa last month was picked by Formula 1 Academy for the two-round COTFA UAE championship. With more eyeballs on this championship, there was additional pressure to deliver and Atiqa did not disappoint. She clinched the pole position, becoming the first-ever female in



the world to achieve this feat in COTFA mini class before adding a Heat win to a successful weekend. She capped off a memorable week by finishing third in the final. Atiqa was coming into the weekend after a stellar October when she secured multiple podiums across championships including a race win at the RMC Championship.

No Sense : Gautam Gambhir, Shubman Gill's 1st Test Selection Shocker Slammed By Ex India Star

Despite registering scores of 87 and 39 in his last Test for India, Sai Sudharsan had no place in the team for the first Test against South Africa at Eden Gardens, starting Friday. Sudharsan was replaced by Dhruv Jurel in the Indian team as skipper Shubman Gill and head coach Gautam Gambhir went ahead with a bowlingheavy side. India named as many as 4 spinners and 2 pacers for the Test, while also picking 2 specialist wicket-keeper batters in the team. The team composition triggered a big debate on social media. Sudharsan has been seen as India's longterm bet for the No. 3 spot. The batter was drafted into the team after Cheteshwar Pujara's exit. But, the management already seems to be losing its hope in



the young left-hander. Dodda Ganesh, one of India's former cricketers, took a sharp swipe at the decision. He posted on social media: "Why would you drop Sai Sudharsan? Makes no sense whatsoever." "The no 3 in the batting lineup is the most important slot in a test XI & India is playing musical chairs without a vision. Can't believe this is happening at the test

level. Should've given Sai Sudharsan these tests. You don't need 4 spinners, no matter how much turn the pitch offers," he wrote in another post on X. At the time of toss, India skipper Gill refused to explain the reason behind the change. He said: "I think the only toss that I'm going to win is hopefully in the WTC finals. Yeah. Looks like a good surface. Hopefully, we'll get some movement early, hopefully we're able to extract that. Dressing room is pretty amazing.
